From Your Township Supervisor—John W. Morgan

Sumpter Township was saddened by the death of Township Clerk, Clarence J. Hoffman, Jr. Mr. Hoffman leaves behind a nearly 40 year legacy of involvement in Sumpter politics and served in every position on the Township board at various times in his political career.

Mr. Hoffman was more than a politician. He was a community activist and played a vital role in many improvements in Sumpter Township over the past three decades. He also served as a police officer in Sumpter Township where he served with honor and distinction. Mr. Hoffman will certainly be missed as this Township Board expresses its deepest sympathy to the Hoffman family.

The state of Sumpter Township continues to be excellent. The Township's finances continue to be solidly in the black and our bond rating is tops in the area.

All Township departments are operating at a high level of efficiency and are all operating within their budgets. Negotiations with all employee unions are settled with the exception of the FOP, however, negotiations are amicable and a settlement will be forthcoming.

Sumpter Township has completed its conversion to LED street lighting; saving over \$8,000 per year. The Township also received a rebate of over \$3,600. The



police department appreciates the brightness of the new street lights.

Sumpter Township recently auctioned off and sold 12 township owned unbuildable properties to neighboring property owners; thereby putting these parcels back on the

tax rolls.

A facelift has begun on the front entrance of the Township hall and surrounding grounds. Old fencing was removed along with dead trees. The front entrance will soon be graced with 3 flag poles flying our United States Flag, a Michigan Flag and a Sumpter Township Flag. The old flag pole will be recycled and moved to Graham Park.



Our ordinance officer is doing a great job of getting compliance on blighted Township properties, however, there is still much to be done. Remember, we all benefit when our surroundings are free of blight. Our property values remain steady and our neighborhoods are refreshed and revitalized.

The present Township Board works very hard daily to serve the needs of all of our citizens and to provide these services cost effectively and with the utmost courtesy and respect to the citizens who put their trust in us and depend on us to provide the leadership that ensures that Sumpter Township will remain the crown jewel of the tri-community area and will continue to be a great place to live.

From Your Treasurer - Peggy Morgan

During the first week of July 2017 the Summer Tax Bill was sent in the mail. The Summer Bill is pink. The Treasurer's office is using pink for summer bills, and blue for winter bills. Payment must be received by Sumpter Township Treasurer's office only. We accept cash, checks and money orders. You have until September 14, 2017 to pay your taxes without penalty. After that date 1% interest charge will be added monthly. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call the Treasurer's office at 461-6201 ext. 2239.

New to the Treasurer's office is that tax bill amounts and water bill amounts only can be accessed online at <u>www.sumptertwp.com</u> under the



department tab. You will be directed to a link BS & A website. You can set

up your account and have access to your amounts due. This is for information only, not payments. You can make payments through your own bank and they will send a physical check to Sumpter Township.

Senior citizens, disabled people, veterans, surviving spouses of veterans and farmers may be able to delay paying summer property taxes. **Eligible** taxpayers can apply for a summer tax deferment with this office. This means that the due date would be extended to the end of February without penalty charges; but the full amount of the tax bill must be paid by the end of February.

Currently there are several programs in place to assist low-income persons with their property taxes. Senior citizens, veterans, surviving spouses of eligible veterans and disabled persons may be eligible for larger tax relief. Contact the Wayne County Department of Human Services – DHS for further information. 313-224-6105. For your convenience if the Township hall is not open, there is a drop box located to the right of the double doors on the front of the building. This is a secure location right in the Treasurer's office.

Just a reminder the Treasurer's office is open 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday thru Friday and open late on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Tuesday each month 8:30 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

Monday, September 4, 2017, Sumpter Township will be closed for Labor Day.

Blight Enforcement is Ramping Up

Most residents take pride in the appearance of their property. Keeping everything clean and tidy benefits everyone, from increased property values, both monetary and aesthetic, to better relations between neighbors. Unfortu-



nately, some who don't meet the community's expectations just don't care. More times than not though, those who fall short just

need a little help. Either way, the Sumpter Township ordinance department is ramping up enforcement efforts throughout the township.

For the past month or so, the ordinance officer has been out and about talking with residents and assisting property owners who need help. He is also using the legal power of local ordinances to push the less receptive residents to clean up their property. The township has been broken down into four quadrants and the ordinance officer spends one week in a quadrant, documenting issues, talking with residents, etc. before moving on to the next. Once he has completed the cycle and is back to the first quadrant, he will take the next steps necessary in dealing with the previously documented issues involving specific addresses and deal with any new issues he finds in that area. The normal process is that once the ordinance officer identifies an issue contact is made with the resident to discuss what needs to be done. A 14-day window is given and if noticeable progress is made we will continue in that manner to get the property up to standards. In the event that progress is not made during that time, an ordinance violation citation will be issued and the resident will be summonsed to appear at the 34th District Court. While the case is making its way through the court process the ordinance officer will continue monitoring the property and report back to the court with any progress, or lack thereof. Please remember though, our goal is compliance for the betterment of the township, not a misdemeanor conviction.

If you have a neighbor whose property is in need of help, or are the owner of the property in question but don't know how to begin the cleanup process, please don't hesitate to contact the ordinance department at 734-740-0059, or via



email at ordinance@sumptertwp.com. We have several avenues available to assist in the cleanup.

We appreciate your effort and cooperation in making Sumpter Township a cleaner and more attractive community for all to enjoy.

your non-toxic items to the landfill twice a month located at Clark & Oakville Waltz on Wednesday afternoons from 2:30 pm until 4:30 pm and Saturday mornings from 7:00 am until 12:30 pm.

The Recycling Center is open Saturdays , 9:00 am until 1:00 pm, behind Sumpter Township Hall. Tires are accepted, both on and off rims, for a small fee.

Water & Sewer Department Ken Kunka, Superintendent

Water Customers:

It's important that our customers receive accurate bills for the amount of water consumed by their household. Thus it is imperative that when Township Water Department leaves a notice at your property requesting access to our metering equipment,

that an appointment be promptly scheduled with the water billing department at (734) 461-6201 ex 2242.

Water testing:

Sumpter Township Water Department working with GLWA and MDEQ routinely tests the Township water to insure that a high quality product is delivered to your homes. In addition Township employees routinely check and provide necessary maintenance to over 1100 fire hydrants in the township.

Sewer Customers:

The Environment One grinder pump is capable of accepting and pumping a wide range of materials. However certain materials can cause damage to your pump and might result in you being charged with costly repair bills.

Please **DO NOT** introduce these materials plus any similar materials into your system.

Kitchen grease, Glass, Cotton swabs, Metal, Aquarium gravel, Seafood shells, Personal / cleaning wipes and sponges, Plastic objects (toys, utensils, etc.), Sanitary napkins or tampons, Diapers, socks, rags or cloth, Disposable toothbrushes, Kitty litter, Cigarette butts, Syringes, Latex / Vinyl items, Dental floss.

Caution: Kitchen garbage disposals do not keep grease/oil out of the plumbing system.

In addition you must never introduce into any sewer: Explosives, Flammable material, Strong chemicals, Gasoline, Lubricating oil and/or grease.

IN PERIODS OF DISUSE: If your home is left unoccupied for longer than a couple of weeks, perform the following procedure on your grinder pump system.

PURGE THE SYSTEM: Run clean water into the unit until the pump activates. Immediately turn off the water and allow the grinder pump to run until it shuts off.

DO NOT DISCONNECT THE POWER TO THE UNIT!

IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING A BROWN OUT OR POWER OUTAGE, SHUT OFF YOUR GRINDER PUMP UNTIL POWER IS RESTORED AND USE AS LITTLE AS POSSIBLE DURING SUCH TIMES.

Our police department has tak-I HAVE NARCAN en some lifesaving training on the use of the drug Naloxone ASK FOR (Narcan) which reverses the MY HELP! effects of an opioid drug overdose. All the officer's training was paid for by a grant from Wayne County Mental Health

Board; it covered not only the cost of the training but also the antidote kits for each police cruiser. This is great news for the residents!

The fire department is hitting on all cylinders. The 2 new brush trucks (Ford F-350) have arrived and are awaiting the installation of lights, si-



rens and radios, along with some firefighting equipment

to suppress grass fires. These new trucks will replace our approximately 25 year old trucks, and can carry twice the personnel. These new trucks will be in-service no later than the end of September.
