My staff and I have been working diligently to familiarize ourselves with the new procedures and equipment, to better serve our residents. As of August of last year we have had three school elections within our jurisdiction, but the majority of our residents haven't had the opportunity to utilize the equipment as of yet. So as we gear up for the 2018 August primary, I'd personally like to invite the residents of Sumpter Township to an open house to tryout the new election equipment on Wednesday, July 18th at 5:00 pm. I hope to see you there!

2018 Elections

On August 7, 2018, the primary elections will be held at your precinct location. A map of the precinct locations can be viewed on our website at http://sumptertwp.com/
Clerks Office.html. Absentee applications and sample ballots can be picked up at the Clerk's office during normal business hours.

Election Workers Needed

If you are interested in becoming an election inspector, please stop by the Clerk's Office to fill out an application or visit our website at www.sumptertwp.com. The following requirements are required to apply:

- U.S. Citizen and a State of MI Resident
- 16 & 17 years of age
- 18 years + must be a registered voter in the State of Michigan
- Specify a political party affiliation
- Submit an Election Inspector Application, W4, and an Employee Verification Form
- Attend a paid Election Training Session
- Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m. (Working hours after polls open and close may vary.)
- Daily pay ranges from \$160 \$180
- Anyone with a felony conviction is excluded from eligibility

Recycling

The Recycling Center is open on Saturdays from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm. The center will be closed on holiday weekends, to see a current 2017-2018 calendar you can visit our website at www.sumptertwp.com. There is no fee to recycle except for the recycling of tires. The fee schedule for recycling tires is listed below:

Facility Rental

Sumpter Township has two parks located within the township (Banotai and Graham) which have pavilions available to rent, with a capacity of 50 people for a fee of \$50.00. Stop by the Clerk's office to see a full list of rentals or to book a facility.

Large Trash Items

FOR RENT

If you have large items to throw away (furniture, sink, carpeting, etc.), you must call Republic Waste (877) 264-5544, for a "special pick-up", **before** setting it out at the roadside. Republic Waste will give you instructions on how you need to prepare your item for pickup.

Landfill Permits

Landfill permits are available at the Clerk's Office. You must have a current driver's license with a Sumpter Township address. You will be able to take your non-toxic items to the landfill twice a month (not to exceed a five (5) cubic yard maximum per month). The landfill is located at Clark & Oakville Waltz on Wednesday afternoons from 2:30 pm until 4:30 pm and Saturday mornings from 7:00 am until 12:30 pm.

SALE

Garage/Yard Sale Permits

The Township of Sumpter requires that all residents wishing to host a garage or yard sale obtain a permit through the Clerk's office. The permit is valid for a four (4) consecutive day sale. Residents may hold a maximum of five (5) garage sales per year. The cost is \$2 for each permit, with thirty (30) days between each garage/yard sale.



From Your Treasurer—Peggy Morgan

During the first week of July 2018 the Summer Tax Bill will be sent in the mail. The Summer Bill is the color Pink. The Treasurer's office is using pink for summer bills, and blue for the winter bills. Payment must be received by Sumpter Township Treasurer's office only. We accept cash, checks and money orders. You will have until September 14, 2018 to pay your taxes without penalty. After that date a 1% interest charge will be added monthly. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call the Treasurer's office at (734) 461-6201 ext. 2245.

Senior citizens, disabled people, veterans and farmers may be able to delay paying summer property taxes. Eligible taxpayers can apply for a summer tax deferment with this office. This means that the due date would be extended to the end of February without penalty charges; but the full amount of the tax bill must be paid by the end of February.

Currently there are several programs in place to assist low-income persons with their property taxes. Senior citizens, veterans, surviving spouses of eligible veterans and disabled persons may be eligible for larger tax relief. Contact the Wayne County Department of Human Services-DHS for further information. (313) 224-6105.

Just a friendly reminder. Tax bill amounts and water bill amounts can be accessed online at www.sumptertwp.com under the Treasurer's department tab. You will be directed to a link BS&A website. You can set up your account and have access to your amounts due. This is for information only, not payments. You can make payment through your own bank account and they will send a physical check to Sumpter Township.

The Treasurer's office is open Monday thru Friday 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. and open late on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month until 7:00 p.m.

Reporting (UCR) Program.

This year, Alarms.org and the National Council for Home Safety and Security released their annual list of the safest cities in Michigan. Here is the methodology they used:

"To identify the safest cities in Michigan, we reviewed the most recent FBI Uniform Crime Report statistics along with our own population data and internal research. We eliminated any cities that failed to submit a complete crime report to the FBI and removed cities with populations under 10,000.

The remaining cities were ranked based on the number of reported violent crimes (aggravated assault, murder, rape, and robbery) and property crimes (burglary, arson, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft) per 1,000 people. These variables were then weighted, with violent crimes accounting for 1.5 of the total (due to their severity) than property crimes. "

While we fell just short of the population threshold of 10,000 residents to be included on this particular list, our crime rate numbers would put Sumpter Township at approximately #25. The statistics they used to compile the rankings show us at an estimated census number of 9,265 residents. We believe we're actually several hundred higher... which would make our numbers even better!

Our crime rates per 1,000 residents are as follows:

Violent Crime = .75 (yes you read that right, .75!)

Property Crime = 10.04



By comparison, the averages for the State of Michigan are:

Violent Crime = 6.11

Property Crime = 23.98

As to our standing compared to neighboring communities, Canton Township is #38 (1.69 & 11.48 respectively), Huron Township is #44 (1.17 & 12.67), Van Buren Township is #84 (3.88 & 23.39) and Romulus comes in at # 111 (7.25 & 29.38). The City of Belleville, who also doesn't meet the population threshold to be included on this list has a crime rate of 1.55 violent & 23.32 property.

These excellent crime rates for Sumpter Township would not be possible but for the great partnership between the department and you, the residents we proudly serve. We thank you for being vigilant partners and continuing to report all suspicious activity to our dispatch at 734-461-6898.

From Your Finance Dept.— Scott Holtz, Finance Director

Year End and Fiscal Audit -

Currently, Post, Smythe, Lutz and Ziel are here auditing fiscal year 2018 (April 1, 2017 – March 31, 2018). With their help, we are looking at our current practices and reviewing our Internal Controls and Internal Processes to improve Sumpter Township's operations. Along with this, our Consolidated Audited Financial Reports (CAFR) will be presented to the Township Board and submitted to the State of Michigan no later than September 30, 2018.

Unfunded Pension Liability –

One of the major issues across the State of Michigan is local government's unfunded pension liability. I will receive the new statement for year ending December 31, 2017 from Municipal Employees' Retirement System (MERS) by the end of June, 2018. Last year, our funding ratio was 74.3% funded. Many municipalities' retirements were affected during the Recession of 2008. The State of Michigan has passed new laws to make governmental units resolve unfunded balances. At Sumpter, we have been making extra payments to make up this unfunded liability without causing an impact for our residents.

Financial State of the Township -

Sumpter Township is in a good financial position. Building permits, Metro Act dollars and State Revenue Sharing have increased, bringing more dollars into the township. With that, we are consistently watching expenditures for necessity and cost savings.





Water & Sewer Department—Ken Kunka, Superintendent

Water Customers:

Reading your water meter, which is located in the basement or utility room, and keeping track of how much water your household uses will help identify any unusual water usage. In just 10 minutes you can search your home for leaks and crack down on any water waste. Worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets, an overset humidifier, a leak in your water heater and leaking showerheads all are easily correctable and can save on your water bill.

It's important that our customers receive accurate bills for the amount of water consumed by their household. Thus, it is imperative that when Township Water

Department leaves a notice at your property requesting access to our metering equipment, that an appointment be promptly scheduled with the water billing department at (734) 461-6201 ex 2242.

In the event of a fire, could a firefighter easily find the fire hydrant nearest your home? Does it get buried under a pile of snow in the winter or covered with

overgrowth during the summer. Our DPW crews are at work trying to keep the hydrants uncovered during all seasons but various job responsibilities limit the time required for this task. The Township Fire Department and DPW are encouraging residents to "adopt-a-fire-

hydrant" near your home to keep clear from snow and over growth. This will help ensure hydrants are visible and speed the response time in case of a fire.

Sewer Customers:

The Environment One grinder pump is capable of accepting and pumping a wide range of materials. However certain materials can cause damage to your pump and might result in you being charged with costly repair bills. ...continued, page 15

- ⇒ Please **DO NOT** introduce these materials plus any similar materials into your system.
- ⇒ Kitchen grease, Glass, Cotton swabs, Metal, Aquarium gravel, Seafood shells, Personal / cleaning wipes and sponges, Plastic objects (toys, utensils, etc.), Sanitary napkins or tampons, Diapers, socks, rags or cloth, Disposable toothbrushes, Kitty litter, Cigarette butts, Syringes, Latex / Vinyl items, Dental floss.
- ⇒ Caution: Kitchen garbage disposals do not keep grease/oil out of the plumbing system.
- ⇒ In addition you must never introduce into any sewer: Explosives, Flammable material, Strong chemicals, Gasoline, Lubricating oil and/or grease.
- ⇒ **IN PERIODS OF DISUSE:** If your home is left unoccupied for longer than a couple of weeks, perform the following procedure on your grinder pump system.
- ⇒ **PURGE THE SYSTEM:** Run clean water into the unit until the pump activates. Immediately turn off the water and allow the grinder pump to run until it shuts off.
- ⇒ DO NOT DISCONNECT THE POWER TO THE UNIT
- ⇒ IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING A BROWN OUT OR POWER OUTAGE, SHUT OFF YOUR GRINDER PUMP UNTIL POWER IS RESTORED AND USE AS LITTLE AS POSSIBLE DURING SUCH TIMES.

• When you're enrolled in Medicare, you'll get your red, white, and blue Medicare card in the mail. If you're automatically enrolled, you'll get your red, white, and blue Medicare card in the mail 3 months before your 65th birthday or your 25th month of getting disability benefits. Your Medicare card shows that you have Medicare health insurance. It shows whether you have Part A (Hospital Insurance), Part B (Medical Insurance) or both, and it shows the date your coverage starts.

Be sure to carry your card with you when you're away from home. Let your doctor, hospital, or other health care provider see your card when you need hospital, medical or other health services.
